October 27, 2021 - Club Meeting Minutes:

Meeting at 7:00 p.m. Eighteen (18) members were present.

The October meeting was called to order by president John Heiser at 7pm. 18 members were present. Introductions of existing members were given for new members Danny and Carol Rohde. Recent events were reviewed. The Palm Springs Great Western Fan Belt Toss had seven members in attendance and the Sterling Restoration Event in Fairfield had a good turnout of the San Francisco Corvair Club and a few of our members. Discussion at this event for a possible joint show with other clubs at this same location or a possible alternate location with more foot traffic. Planning will be ongoing for this event, possibly to occur in the Spring. Our club Christmas party will be held on Sunday, December 5th beginning at 5pm at Sun City in Roseville. Tickets are \$20 per member and will include a buffet dinner and entertainment. New business items were further discussion of the Christmas party and a motion of two tiered pricing was made for \$20 tickets for members and immediate family and \$25 tickets for non-members. 16 members voted in favor, 1 against and 1 abstention; motion carried.

Secretary Erin announced that the National Corsa organization has a special discount on virtual memberships for \$25/year until 12/31/21. Also, the national is asking for local chapters to share their newsletters and it was recommended that we share ours. Erin reminded members that the November meeting date as scheduled was the Wednesday before Thanksgiving and it was decided that the November meeting would be held the week prior on Wednesday 11/17. 



The 1963 Chevrolet Corvair Monza SS concept car made its public debut at the 1963 New York Auto Show. <u>Larry Shinoda</u> and <u>Tony Lapine</u>, working under <u>Bill Mitchell's</u> directions at the GM Design Studio, designed the SS roadster.

The SS was based on a shortened Corvair platform with a fiberglass body. The engine, left in its stock location, behind the transaxle was a six cylinder, air cooled Corvair engine that featured a unique intake manifold fitted with six carburetors and a modified exhaust system that exited through special side outlets. With a wheelbase of just 88-inches, the rear mounted engine helped give this short wheelbase roadster a comfortable cockpit, featuring fixed seats with adjustable pedals and the added benefit of a small luggage compartment.

The "U"-shaped windshield was five inches high and swept around the entire passenger compartment to the rear of the doors. Headlights were concealed and the rear fin behind the driver included a built-in roll bar. The SS was equipped with four-wheel disc brakes, magnesium wheels and was only 30-inches tall.
