Article of the Month

Tradition versus Safety, no hate mail please -By Michael Brassil, CCRC Member

My late convertible came with two seat belt issues because it has bucket seats with lap belts. The first issue is the lack of protection from the steering wheel and shaft. The second is the large metal buckle directly in the middle of the lap belts. I want protection from the solid steering column and the large metal buckle in the event of an accident. My car is a driver, not a concourse vehicle and I will be driving my family around in it. I just couldn't leave the safety issue alone. I know some owners will disagree with me.

Here is what I did:

I removed the lap belts which were somehow bolted to the seat mounts. I replaced the extended seat mounts with the factory mounts. The car had Clark extensions and they made the new belts difficult to install because they are too close to the factory belt mount holes. I used the seat bolt holes that place to seat to the most outside position. This allows for the increased width of the seat buckle tube. The plastic tube on the buckle side is important for easy attachment of the belt. It does have width.

I cleaned out the factory belt mounts. These may have a plug or just dirt in them. They are to the rear of the seats, with one the floor and one in the outside rail.

The new three points belts came with 7/16 bolts and washers. The buckle end of the belt has a hard plastic sleeve to keep it in place on the inside of the seat. However, because of the floor bolt hole location the buckle will not reach the front of the seat back. I bought 6 inch extensions for this buckle side only. I cut the tip of the plastic buckle tube and attached the 6 inch extension with 7/16 24 bolts and Loc Tite. I bolted to extension the floor with the metal end facing up and forward . This puts the buckle where it is easy to attach, but not in a position to contact my body in an accident. The buckle is at the very inside end of the seat.

I didn't want to drill anymore holes than needed, so I used the outside seat belt mount hole to attach both the spring return mechanism and the lap belt mount. I left a little play here for easy movement of the mechanism and belt. On the shoulder mount I drilled a hole 1.7 inches below the window and 2.5 inches back from the plastic in the inside panel of the rear side window. I considered other areas and this seemed the best option.

To attach the shoulder mount is a bit tricky because there is not much room in the panel. The window regulator takes it up. You don't want to drop a bolt here . I cleaned up the burrs and slightly opened the hole. Take a piece of cardboard and poke a hole in it. Place the 7/19 bolt and washer through the cardboard and then through the rubber opening forward of the window. Using a finger or tool push the bolt though the hole from the inside out. (The mount has a nylon bushing for a bearing surface.) Place a castle nut on the bolt. I used a castle nut here to get a tight closure while leaving enough slack for the mount to move easily. This will make use of the belt easier. The kit has a plastic cover that makes the whole thing look like it has always been there.

The finished product looks great and is very comfortable to drive with. See photos (pg 8).
