
# Article of the Month Battery Disabling Theft Protection, Revisited -By Larry Forman, CCRC Member

A few months ago I wrote an article on how to protect your vehicle from theft by completely disabling the battery. I was asked to add a schematic to help explain how this works. I will include a schematic as part of this article.

There are two ways to disable the battery with a simple On/Off battery switch. The switch can go in either the positive or negative battery line. While either approach will work perfectly, adding a switch to the positive line likely means it is more difficult to move the ON/OFF battery switch to a more convenient location. Adding the ON/OFF battery switch to the negative line usually will only involve making the negative line longer for a more convenient position, plus a short line from the chassis ground to the other switch terminal. For my 65 Monza, I will add a longer negative ground line so I can mount the ON/OFF switch right next to the under rear seat heater duct. Thus I can easily reach around to turn that switch OFF for protection and ON so I can drive again. Since I purchased a battery switch with a removable handle, I could remove that handle for added protection.

Adding the negative battery lead switch will require me purchasing a slightly longer negative battery lead and also running a short ground lead from the switch to the chassis, making darn sure the ground lead makes a very good electrical contact and removing any chassis paint at the connection point. I also need to make sure that that longer negative battery lead uses grommets as needed to ensure the battery lead will not contact ground as it goes through chassis sheet metal.

As I mentioned in the other article, an additional advantage of cutting off the battery will stop any small battery draining devices and keep your battery in perfect condition for long term storage. This also means if you have an auxiliary charger plugged into the lighter socket, it will not work when the battery is switched off.
